Keadue on Irish T.V. Monday 21st. September. The recent unveiling and launch of the Finger Signs Information Panels and Plaques in Keadue as part of heritage Week will be shown on Irish T V channel **191** on Roscommon County Matters at 6.30pm.

History of early Christianity: A series of three talks on the history of early Christianity from a different perspective, will be presented by Alf Monaghan in Galilee Community, Boyle on Tuesdays, October 13th, 20th & 27th. at - 8pm each night. They ask many questions and confound some of the accepted theories about the history of early Christianity in Ireland. They trace links with ancient Egypt, connect Irish monasticism with the Desert Fathers and the early Irish Church with the Coptic Church. Recent Irish discoveries such as the Fadden More Psalter – *Egyptian papyrus found in an ancient book of the psalms from a Tipperary bog* – are clues pointing to a more substantial eastern Mediterranean influence in early Irish Christianity, than has been acknowledged to date. In this series of talks Alf shares some of his experience of Eastern and North African influences on religion which made Ireland the "Insula Sacea" of the ancients
