Peter and Paul are the two ancient pillars of the Church. These two great Apostles were the great builders of the Church of which Jesus was the foundation stone. Both are wonderful examples of how God can use imperfect human materials to accomplish His purposes.

Peter was a fisherman. He was impetuous and he had to suffer the painful shame of having publicly denied his beloved Master before he became a fit rock on which the Church could stand.

Paul, for his part, started life as a fanatical Pharisee full of hatred and violence against those who disagreed with his beliefs, and he had to be temporarily blinded on the road to Damascus before he saw the light, the light of Christ.

Peter's tomb almost certainly lies under the High Altar in the modern St Peter's, and St Paul's in St Paul's Outside the Walls. It is their faith we share today, we, who in our own ways, are still continuing the work of building up the Church on earth.
